**Reminder to Residents:** Please remember that only toilet paper should be flushed down the toilet. Items such as wipes (even those labeled “flushable”), paper towels, feminine hygiene products, diapers, and other household items can cause serious plumbing and sewer backups. These blockages are costly to repair and can lead to service disruptions for everyone. Help protect our sewer system—when in doubt, throw it in the trash, not the toilet.

**Tree Trimming Reminder:** We want to remind everyone of their responsibility to keep the sidewalks and intersections free of tree limbs that obstruct paths or impair traffic. City code states that treelimits must be at least 7.5 feet from the surface of the sidewalk or driveway and at least 12 feet from the surface of the roadway. This is addressed in Title 9 Chapter 2 Section 9.

**Dog Licenses:** All dogs over six months old are required to be licensed with the City. Annual licenses are \$5 per dog, or you can choose a lifetime license for \$25 per dog. License application forms are available online at <https://cityofgeneseec.com/government-city/documents>, or you’re welcome to stop by City Hall to fill one out in person.
